

Lions Health, Day 2: Fear factors, pharma humor and how can we win next year?

CANNES, France—Pharma is getting funny, and it's working. That's one Lions takeaway for attendees from Syneos Health, whose execs reflected on the sessions and shortlisted work in a cabana where staff was setting up for a party, but allowing visitors into its shade on sufferance. “I'm just excited to see pharma continue to experiment with its emerging humorous voice, and trying to figure out how to talk about healthcare in a light way,” said Leigh Householder, EVP and managing director of innovation and insight.

She listed a few examples on this year's awards shortlist, including a Danish campaign for sunblock, Help Dave, featuring a woeful sunbather with unfortunate tan lines, and the Lions-winning social campaign for Takeda's antidepressant Trintellix, created by McCann New York and Klick Health.

"We're just starting to see how pharma brands are figuring out how to infuse a little bit of the humor our patients have, and I'm really liking it."

"And it gives them a much more human voice because of it," chimed in Sam Cannizzaro, executive creative director of GSW Advertising. "Humor makes it more youthful... brands can feel more real, authentic, conversational, rather than using data point after data point after data point."

Book Review

Naked

By David Sedaris

Reading this collection of stories in my front yard means laughing- out of control, even stopping pedestrians on the street. Sedaris regales us with stories about his family from North Carolina- Mom his confidant and wise teacher, helps him grow up to be strong amid imaginatively clever sisters plus his red- necked brother.

You may see your own father in David's patriarch, as he saves dough, wears clownishly mismatched colors and worships golf. I found the wardrobe of his father beyond hysterical, even as I tolerate my father- in- law, who at 89 wears pants labeled "starting line-up." This book is truly medicinal.

David's hindsight is 20/20 on travelogues, his former deranged employers and his one true love, Hugh. His sparkling vocabulary and timing combine well with the characters, who will take you out of yourself into a supreme humor release. He has found the funny bone and tickles it incessantly.
